The good news is that you don't have to wait until Christmas to see it on TV this year; they're supposed to show it on Thanksgiving Day going up against the NFL football games. 30 of the strongest men in the world were seeded into five heats of six men each with the two winners in each heat going on to the final. The final was held August 19-20 with three events on each day. Each day's events started at 9 am, the 2nd event of the day at noon and the last event at 3 pm. Iceland had a large contingent on hand to root on their guy; they all wore blue t-shirts. There were some notable no-shows for this contest as they chose to compete in the first Arnold Strongman Classic Asia in Hong Kong: Zydrunas Savickas LIT; Vytautas Lalas LIT; Dimitar Savatinov BUL and others.

Event 1- Frame Carry —an 825 lb (375 kg) frame was carried like a farmer's walk except instead of carrying two weights each athlete stepped inside of the huge frame with a handhold on each side, lifted it and carried it 49-2 ½ (15 m) out and the same distance back. Fastest time won. Shahlei ENG injured his calf and withdrew after the next event.

Event 2- Circus Barbell Press - 352 lb (160 kg) was lifted overhead for maximum reps.

Event 3- Max Deadlift-lifters worked up to a one-rep maximum deadlift. Results:

Second Day:

Event 4-Plane Pull-a 40-ton plane was pulled 82-0 (25 m) for the fastest time or greatest distance if the total distance wasn't achieved.

Event 5-Kettlebell Toss- a kettlebell was tossed for max height over a crossbar. There's a rumor that Hafthor Bjornsson ICE broke the world record in this event. It wouldn't be too big a surprise because he already holds the official WR at 19-5 for the 56 lb weight over bar that was done at the 2016 Arnold Classic in March in Columbus, Ohio. No weight has been announced for this kettlebell toss yet nor the height cleared by each individual.

Event 6-Atlas Stones- five stones of different weights from 330 lb (150 kg) to 440 lb (200 kg) were loaded onto barrels of about four feet in height. The goal was the quickest time to load the greatest number of stones. As of press time we couldn't find out the trest of the order of finish for the last four contestants. **Results:**
